As you read these passages, see what you can learn about Jesus' sacrifice as the Lamb of God. Be sure to make notes in the space below each verse reference.

John 1:29	1 Peter 1:18-21	Revelation 5:9-13

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Look back at your notes about the Passover lamb and its blood. (See Pre-Dig above.) What did the lamb's blood protect the people of Israel from?
If you've accepted Jesus' sacrifice for your sins, what does his blood protect you from?
Picture this: Imagine Jesus' blood pouring down his body—from the nails in his hands, the crown of thorns o his head, the spear in his side, the slaps in his face, and the floggings. At the base of the cross, a pool of bloo is forming—and in that pool is a drop of blood with your name on it. Take a moment to create something the expresses to Jesus what that drop of blood means to you: Write a prayer, a poem, a song lyric, or a simple thank-yo note. If you're artistically inclined, draw a picture or create some type of artistic representation of your gratitude.

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Let's get personal. 1 Peter says that Jesus' blood redeems us from an "empty way of life." How would you define an empty way of life? How does your definition compare to how you've been living?

How have you changed as a result of Jesus' sacrifice for you? To help you answer, read 1 Peter 1:22–2:3 from your Bible. (It's a continuation of the passage you just read.) As you read, look for two things and list them below:

- 1. Look for any benefits you can experience as a result of Jesus' sacrifice.
- 2. Look at what your behavior should look like because of Jesus' sacrifice.
